Lord teach us how to pray...

On many occasions Jesus withdrew from the crowds to pray. Sometimes alone and

sometimes with His disciples.

He taught His disciples, and us, how to pray, saying when you pray say "Our Father...."

Prayer is the bedrock of our faith, our communication with God, committing to Him our hopes, fears and plans – BEFORE we make decisions.

Lots of people within our church pray regularly and faithfully, both for our ministry and the wider needs of individuals and the world, but, with the exception of the monthly prayer group there is at present no opportunity for us to pray together, nor to encourage each other in prayer, other than our weekly services.

To encourage us to pray together more frequently and to help each other to grow in prayer over the next few months we will be making the following opportunities available:

t Commencing on 5 February, we will start a weekly Church Prayer Meeting focusing on Church and Ministry – to meet on Monday evenings at the vicarage from 7pm until 7.45pm. This will operate alongside the monthly Tuesday night prayer group and not replace it.

- † We will join with other churches in Mottram, Longdendale and Glossop to meet for prayer every Wednesday morning in Lent from 7.30am to 8.15am followed by breakfast. Meeting each week at a different participating church. The meeting on 28 February will be at St Michael's.
- † In May we'll be concentrating our preaching/teaching on prayer, with the opportunity for prolonged periods of prayer and participating in the Archbishops initiative on evangelism "Thy Kingdom Come". Through this, bringing various groups together in prayer with contributions from the Sunday School, Youth Group, and Monthly Prayer Group helping families and individuals young and old to pray together.
- † Our prayer/healing ministry that currently takes place during or after the 10.30am service on 2nd and 3rd Sundays of the month, will be extended to be available after every 10.30am service. In order to do this we shall need to extend the team.



Freezer Ministry

We're starting a new scheme to help people who are recently bereaved, or just returned from hospital, or suffering from some other acute crisis in their lives.

We're just about to order an upright freezer. This will be stocked with homemade frozen meals, ready to be delivered at short notice to someone in need.





THE WORD

The God who befriends...

Nell Goddard of the London Institute for Contemporary Christianity considers what real friendship can mean...

Better is open rebuke than hidden love. Wounds from a friend can be trusted, but an enemy multiplies kisses. *Proverbs* 27:5-6

As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another. *Proverbs* 27:17

I remember it really clearly: stood in the kitchen of my student house, clutching a cup of tea, and being told – in no uncertain terms – that I needed to be kinder with my words. The deliverer of this stark truth was someone I had met only once before, but who had been invited for dinner by one of my housemates.

In that moment, I knew three things:

Firstly, I was cross. What right did this person have to offer up opinions and rebuke me when they'd only just met me?

Secondly, they were right: I frequently used words as weapons rather than gifts, and they weren't the first person to call me out on it. But – strangely enough – they were the first person I listened to.

Thirdly, we were going to be friends. This realisation surprised me, but I knew it with a deep certainty. And I was right – three years later, they're one of my closest friends.

This story is a worked example of these proverbs, and an illustration of how friendship isn't meant to be consistently comfortable and cosy. True friendship does not shrink from correcting the friend – after all, iron cannot sharpen iron unless forceful contact is made.

These proverbs assume that a friend persists and does not shy away from constructive criticism. Such criticism is done in a way which is open and direct, remaining caring and completely concerned with the best interests of the addressee. Does this ring true for your friendships? Or does it present you with a challenge?

Friendship is a key part of life and so, for the Christian, a key part of discipleship. Through friendship, God teaches us about others, about community, and about Himself. After all, He is the God who calls us friend.

So, what does it mean to be a friend? Each friendship will take a different form, depending on the people engaging in it. Colleagues, family, fellow parents, study partners... wherever we are, whatever we're doing, friends will most likely play a part.

Friendships are significant, presenting us with opportunities for both evangelism and discipleship, as well as for learning more about God, and they are a part of life where we can see God working powerfully – in us and through us, every day.
