Remember to clearly label all items of clothing with your child's name.

Please ensure that children come to school each day with their book bag containing their reading book.

Reading at home is hugely important. Even reading for 5 to 10 minutes every day will make a big difference.

Reception Spring 1 2019 This half term we will be learning about Elephants.



Our topic this half term is Elephants.

Red Class will be adopting an elephant through the WWF. We will be learning all about elephants, what the term endangered means and also looking at books featuring elephants.

Prime Areas

Personal, Social and Emotional Development Children will be thinking about what makes them unique. They will be encouraged to show sensitivity to others' needs and feelings.

Communication and Language

The children will listen to stories, anticipating key events and respond to what they hear with relevant comments.

Physical Development

The children will continue to be taught Dance by Active Tameside and will take part in Multi-Skills lessons. Children will be encouraged to accurately form letters using the correct pencil grip.

Specific Areas

Literacy

The children will continue to write their names and participate in daily phonics sessions. They will begin to write labels and captions relating to elephants.

Maths

The children will count reliably with numbers from 1 to 10. Children will use everyday language to talk about size, weight and capacity to compare quantities and objects and to solve problems.

Understanding the World

Children will be learning about elephants and thinking about their own environment and how it differs to others, for example, the countries where elephants live.

Expressive Arts and Design

The children will be using different media to represent elephants, experimenting with colour mixing and manipulating materials to achieve a planned effect.
