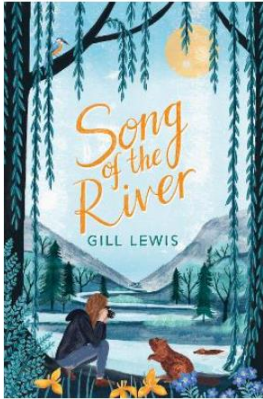

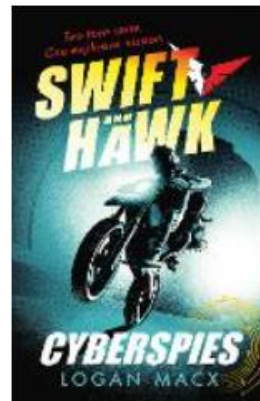
New country. New life. Whole new world . . .

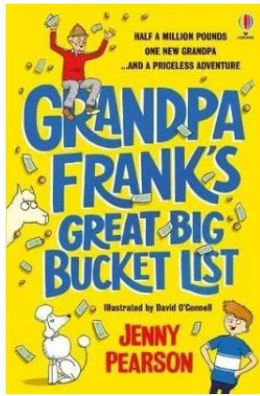

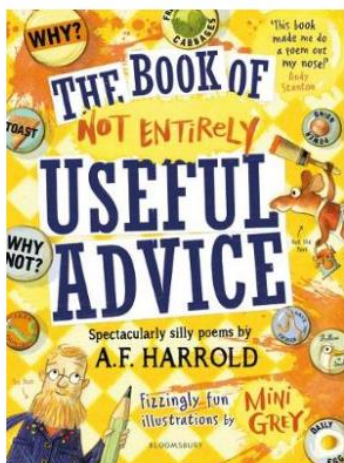
**Grandpa Frank's

Advice comes in many shapes.

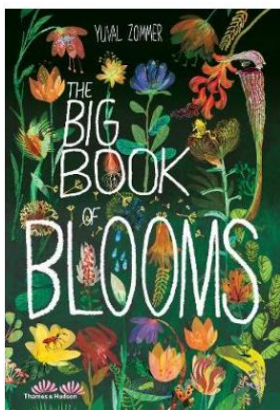
Poems come in many shapes.

What does a venus fly trap eat? How strong is a giant water lily? Does a cactus flower?

It opens with introductory spreads on how to be a botanist; how to recognise different types of flowers; the life-cycle of a plant; flower anatomy; and the seven types of animal pollinators including bats, birds and beetles.

Subsequent spreads, illustrated within various habitats, are dedicated to specific varieties of plants, including the carnivorous venus flytrap, the giant water lily and the weird and wonderful corpse flower.
