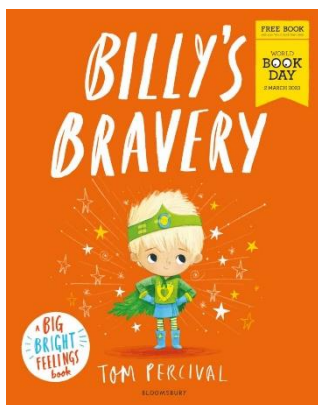

This £1 mini picture book has been created especially for World Book Day 2023.

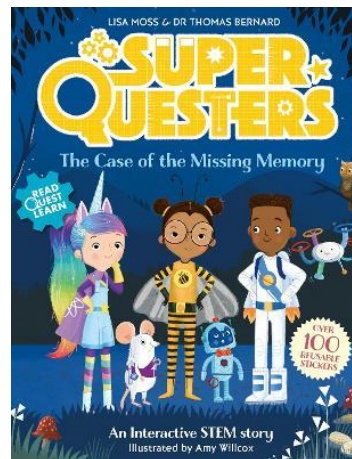

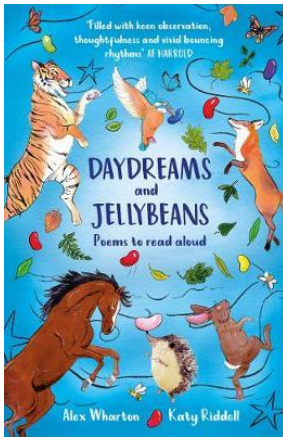


After Fall

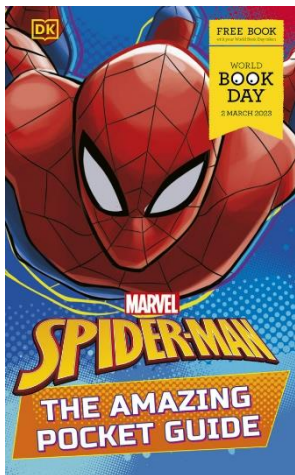


Daydreams and Jellybeans
