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Physical Development

Develop the foundations of a handwriting style which is fast accurate and efficient.

Further develop and refine a range of ball skills.

Throughout the year, develop overall body strength, coordination, balance, and agility needed to engage successfully with future physical education sessions. Use their core muscle strength to achieve a good posture when sitting at a table or on the floor. Develop their small motor skills so that they can use a range of tools competently, safely and confidently. - dough disco, scissor skills, fine motor skill.

Express their feelings and consider the feelings of others. Link to My Happy Mind.

Regular physical activity - Welly walks, exploring the environment.

Communication and Language

Engage in non-fiction books.

Listen to and talk about selected non-fiction to develop a deep familiarity with new knowledge and vocab.

Use new vocabulary in different contexts.

Articulate their ideas and thoughts in well formed sentences, in response to discussions.

Learn new vocabulary - relating to dinosaurs and weather conditions.

Word Aware sessions.

Throughout the year, learn new vocabulary and use in different contexts. Listen to rhymes and song.

Expressive Art and Design

Explore and engage in music making and performing solo or in groups.

Develop story lines in their pretend play - link to dinosaur discoveries.

Music and movement. Children will perform songs with actions.

Art and Design

Create collaboratively, sharing ideas, resources and skills, designing and making own dinosaurs.

Painting / cutting skills/ collage /junk modelling.

Throughout the year, explore use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings.

Comment on situations in the past.

People, Cultures and Communities

The Natural World/ Science

Explore the natural world around them making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants.

Chn will identify animals including dinosaurs and start to identify common body parts such as wings/fins. They will think about what dinosaurs ate and the environments they lived in.

Read a few common exceptions words.

Read some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds for them.

Read simple phrases and sentences.

Blend sounds into words.

Phonics – groups. Extra focus on blending.

Form lower case and capital letters correctly.

Spell words by identifying the sounds and then writing the sound with letters.
